Since our last edition, we have made significant strides:

Enhanced Communication: Our communication program has been modernized, allowing us to reach alumni more efficiently.

Newsletter Launch: The *Gamma-Chi Gazette* has been successfully launched, keeping everyone connected and informed.

Undergraduate Expansion: The Chapter has grown in both size and visibility on campus. The name Kappa Sig is increasingly recognized as a Fraternity on the rise—one that commands respect.

New Website Development: Working with Pennington & Company and the undergraduate Chapter, we are developing a website to house key documents, assist with recruitment, and showcase our successes.

Parents Club Formation: A Parents Club has been founded to support the Chapter through initiatives like Welcome Back Packages and purchasing essential items. This group has made a remarkable positive impact on the Chapter in a very short time, welcoming both members and their families into the Gamma-Chi community.

THE PATH TO EXCELLENCE

While celebrating our progress, we cannot remain idle. With the Chapter's growth comes the need for a new housing scenario. At the recent alumni meeting during Pig Dinner Weekend 2025,



several housing options were discussed:

- Extend our lease at 505 Denison.
- Become an unhoused Fraternity (highly frowned upon).
- Reacquire our old property at 1930 College Heights.

The decision was overwhelmingly in favor of reacquiring the 1930 College Heights Chapter House from K-State—a step that is both exciting and a little daunting. While we understand that this choice may bring a mix of emotions, it is believed that the timing is right to move forward—or, in this case, back.

Further details on this plan will be shared in an upcoming email, including ways alumni can contribute to making this vision a reality.

RYAN URBAN '19 ON FRATERNITY MEMORIES, RECENT K-STATE RECOGNITION

When **Ryan Urban '19** joined Kappa Sigma as a graduate student, he appreciated the opportunity to form new bonds with fellow Wildcats. He credits Gamma-Chi Chapter and former Grand Master **Matt Hockersmith '17** for pushing him to embrace new opportunities with the Fraternity and beyond.

KAPPASIG CONNECTIONS

"I was looking for a way to connect with people at K-State," Ryan said. He stayed busy with various jobs and organizations but made time to contribute through PR/website, merch, and alumni relations chairman roles. He also developed a strong bond with pledge dad **Jake Meyer '14**.

Ryan fondly recalls one night playing cornhole with Jake at Yard Bar, and Jake lifted him around the bar after Jake made the game-winning toss. "Another brother explained he had never seen a closer set of pledge dads/sons. I laugh every time I think of that night."

Kappa Sigma membership taught Ryan to take risks and not let anyone dim his fire. Serving as PR chairman lined him up for a communications internship with Kappa Sigma HQ, which led to a campaign management internship with Intouch Group. Ryan's work on *Gamma-Chi Today* also earned him a writer role for *The Caduceus of Kappa Sigma*. "I like to think Matt Hockersmith ultimately launched my career."

CAREER VENTURES

After earning his graduate degree, Ryan entered a tight advertising job market and worked in email marketing before teaching at KU. He then did contract work with GEHA, spending half the time with Corporate Social Responsibility and half with the Kansas City Chiefs and Baltimore Ravens.

Ryan received a second master's degree from KU and worked with the Kansas Department of Commerce on the *Love, Kansas* campaign. He

currently holds several responsibilities as the marketing manager for Naturion, a mitigation banking company working to repair damaged environments like wetlands. Ryan also teaches two courses at UMKC, and he refines his stained-glass skills in his spare time.

A DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS

This year, K-State honored Ryan as one of two Distinguished Young Alumni. He appreciates the numerous opportunities that have come from his college years, and Ryan considers K-State one of the best universities in the country.

"I'm excited to see what all goes into this award, and I've discovered I have to give a keynote speech at K-State in October. I'm looking forward to talking—something we all know I do way too much."

Beyond *Caduceus* contributions, Ryan stays engaged with Kappa Sigma as a National Communications Commission volunteer and as the Assistant Alumnus Advisor for Upsilon-Psi Chapter at UMKC. He maintains social connections with Jake Meyer and **Brad Crooks '83**, and Ryan appreciates the lifelong impact of fellow alumni like **Brian Bednar '79**, **Mike Gardner '82**, **Justin Hockersmith '83**, and several others.
