Gamma-Chi Revamps Alumni/Chapter Communications Program

Despite this, Justin continued to provide communication and promote brotherhood, and other ad-hoc groups of alumni were formed. We thank our previous alumni association members for their service.

Today, the undergraduate Chapter is hungry to renew a strong relationship with alumni. Both groups could have seized opportunities to strengthen it over the years, but let's focus on the FUTURE! Let's come together and make Kappa Sigma the strongest fraternity at K-State. The undergraduate numbers are growing, and campus presence is increasing. A Chapter House, a strong KSU Foundation Endowment Fund (see Scholarship Section for more details), and a newly formed alumni association are just a few of the positive things happening at K-State.

To improve awareness of what is happening with both groups, we have partnered with Pennington & Company on Chapter communications. Justin will still be point, but we will have Pennington assist with mailings and other communications, like this twice-annual newsletter, as well as donations to keep our brotherhood strong. I am still amazed at how much Justin has done over the years and how much he knows about our Chapter.

As we welcome our new relationship with Pennington, don't forget the Gamma-Chi brothers who contributed so much over the Chapter's existence. I will leave you with this challenge: "Think about that brother that helped you while you were in school and repay that brotherhood by helping one undergraduate or brother in the future."

SERVING AS LEADERS

Undergraduates Highlight Current Success

Over the past year, Gamma-Chi has continued rebuilding the Chapter through great efforts.

NEW MEMBERS

The work of then-Recruitment Chairman **Jordan Blanchat '23** led to 33 new members in 2024, doubling our membership from the previous year. We currently have seven signed bids for spring 2025 and are still recruiting. Recruitment Chairman **Ty Bleckinger '24** and Assistant Recruitment Chairman **Chase Sipiora '24** have begun recruiting for fall far earlier than we did last year, with three fall 2025 bids signed already.

HELPING OTHERS

The Chapter raised over \$22,000 toward philanthropic causes as well as completed 1,540 hours of community service (28 per member) in 2024. We held and competed in multiple events, one of which was Donuts for a Difference with Chi Omega, which raised \$400. We also won Zeta Tau Alpha's Big Man on Campus philanthropy week and were the 2024 Homecoming Week champions.

DEVELOPING LEADERS

Our most notable Brothers in Action event was hosting KSU Men's Basketball Coach Jerome Tang!

The coach spoke at a Chapter meeting, discussing leadership and how the values in his basketball program could be applied in our Chapter. Other Brothers in Action events included a career and résumé workshop from the Kansas State Career Center, a Beers Aren't Bad speaker, the Green Bandana Project for mental health, and a basketball tournament.

ACADEMICS

At the end of 2024, Gamma-Chi averaged 2.37 Ritual Proficiencies per brother, which was over the 2.25 benchmarks for maximum points toward a FACE Award. In the classroom, 44 percent of members achieved at least a 3.25 GPA.

It was a positive year for the Chapter, and with so many freshman and sophomore members, our ceiling for growth in the next few years is quite high. It has been exhilarating to see the Chapter's growth and progress over the last year alone, and I cannot wait to see what is to come.
