RENOVATION UPDATE

Two renovation project options have been proposed by Bowman & Associates Architects. One project includes a full pitched roof over the Dining/Living room wing, a foyer addition for the front porch, exterior renovation of the west entrance and south wall of the living room, including extended porches with overhangs and columns for all three areas. Also included in this plan would be central air con-

ditioning for the living room, dining room & kitchen, and relocation of the roof air-handling units to the ground. The second option, while less "flashy", includes important internal renovations, such as central A/C for all study rooms, re-wiring of the house's entire electrical system, and a fire sprinkler system.

Unfortunately, current fundraising totals are

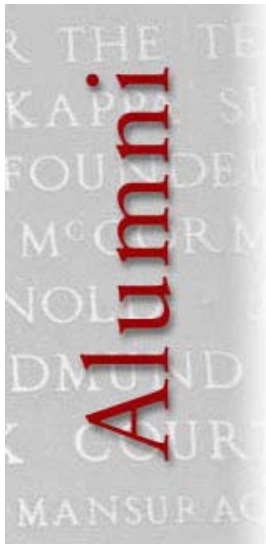
not yet sufficient to finance even one of the two projects, which are estimated at approximately \$250,000 each.

At the conclusion of the Campaign, depending on available funds, the two projects will be assessed and prioritized to determine which project to proceed with. Wouldn't it be great to **not** have to choose between the two options?

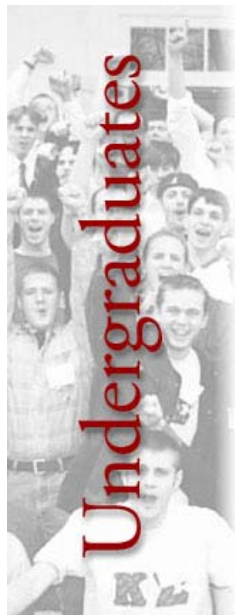
